Week Seven  
Boys

ALLEGANY COUNTY: Dylan Lewis-Ellison of Whitesville. Lewis-Ellison, a 5-foot-9 junior guard, scored 21 points, grabbed five rebounds, handed out six assists made seven steals and blocked two shots in a win over Belfast. He then followed that up with 25 points, eight rebounds and 10 steals in the Bluejays' win over Canaseraga.

FINGER LAKES EAST: Matt McCarthy of Canandaigua. McCarthy, a 6-foot-4 senior forward, scored a career-high 26 points and grabbed 12 rebounds against Geneva. Then McCarthy recorded another double-double scoring 18 points and grabbing a career-high 14 rebounds against Waterloo.
